5. **Nominations for & election of churchwardens for 2024/25:** Two nominations were received from Sue Iles-Palmer and Ann Mayes. As there were no other nominations, they were both duly elected. Sue formally handed a set of keys to Ann.

#### APCM

2. **Approval of 2023 APCM minutes:** all those who were present at the 2023 APCM agreed that the minutes were accurate and a true representation of the meeting.
3. **Matters Arising from 2023 APCM minutes:** no matters arising
4. **Electoral Roll report:** Ken Palmer confirmed there are currently 52 people on the revised electoral roll following the annual revision. (*The number on the Electoral Roll is relevant for the election of Deanery Synod representative(s) and the PCC*).
5. **Elections:**
  - a. **Deanery Synod:** No election this year. The next election is in 2026.
  - b. **PCC lay members:** As the number on the Electoral Roll is over 50 we are entitled to elect up to 9 lay members of the PCC. The term of office is 3 years (rule M16(1) CRR). One third must retire each year and can re-stand for election if they wish.

Laura Whitehouse has retired from the PCC having moved away from the Parish. Thanks was expressed to her for her time in office as PCC member and Safeguarding Officer.

Four nominations were received in writing from Charlotte Elliott, Alex Elliott, Robert Mayes and Ken Palmer and they were all duly elected.

The lay members of the PCC are:

Jane Wilde (re-elected in 2022), Siân Ashby (elected in 2023), Guy Ashby (elected in 2023), Ray Anderson (elected 2023) and Shirley Skeats (elected in 2023), Charlotte Elliott (elected in 2024), Alex Elliott (elected in 2024), Robert Mayes (elected in 2024) and Ken Palmer (elected in 2024).

There are no vacancies for lay members of the PCC. Next year 3 members must retire.

6. **PCC membership re licensed lay readers:** It was proposed that Jane Randells be appointed to the PCC as LLM. Everyone was in agreement and Jane was duly appointed.
7. **Appointment of independent examiner of accounts:** the PCC paid Hills Accountants to independently examine our 2023 and amend errors in the 2022 accounts. It was agreed by all present to continue to use Hills Accountants to examine our accounts and the firm was duly appointed.
8. **Presentation and acceptance of the 2023 examined financial accounts:** the examined accounts (contained in the APCM booklet) had been published on the Pathway Church website and in hard copy in advance of the meeting. These were accepted.
9. **Joint Council Proposal:** a Scheme for Partial Joint Council of Parishes to constitute the 'Pathway Church Joint Council' was set out in the APCM booklet. There were no questions or comments about the proposal. A vote was held in accordance with rule 13(1) CCR. There were 11 voting persons present at the meeting.

## PCC meetings during 2024/25

Meetings were held in April, May, August and November 2024 and in January 2025. Some business was conducted by e-mail and reported on at the following meeting.

### Our Values

This year members of the PCC have been involved in launching a Lego Club for children on a Saturday, an after-school Bible club at New Road School, and 'Open Church' on a Friday morning to be a warm space for people to meet socially.

Our Sunday Worship included a number of teaching series in 2024. Following Eastertide, we began a teaching series which explored the story of influential women in the Bible. We are very thankful to those from St Mary's who co-led the Benefice Alpha Course, Summer Book Club and Bible Study groups last year.

## Our Values

**Welcome and Hospitality:** As a church we have continued to offer refreshments and hospitality before our Sunday Worship as well as after; this helps to provide a warm welcome and also gives more opportunity for our church family to share in fellowship.

**Children & Young People:** A Play Pen was added to our Play & Praise Corner early in 2023 and this continues to be well used during our Sunday worship as well as at Weddings, Baptisms and some Funerals.

**Worship & Generosity:** Supported by our mandate from our PCC, our Sunday Worship continued to evolve throughout 2024 as we experimented with a number of different prayer activities and service delivery styles to engage all ages as we seek to develop a more intergenerational style of worship at St Mary's. Worship Wednesdays continued in 2024 where we had an intergenerational Light Party to counter Halloween. The Worship and Teaching team met several times throughout the year to discuss and help plan our worship and teaching series. We have been excited to see Charlotte & Belinda awarded their ALMs, many congratulations to both of them.

**'Beyond the Building':** As we continue to seek God's vision for God's church in Whittlesey, we share his love and his heart for the people of our town who are yet to know Jesus and life in his name. A number from our church community have been doing excellent work with the local schools. We continue to pray for the Lord's guidance and leading in exploring other opportunities to reach our community.

# Churchwardens' report

Many thanks to **all** who have helped and supported Ann and I in the running of St. Mary's and in all of the many activities this year. We sincerely value all of the support!

The Parish has enjoyed a good year on many counts. We have seen a healthy growth in the number of families and younger people attending services. Families attending Baptism services have given amazing feedback on their enjoyment of the services. There have been many different types of services introduced by Revs. Emily and Lloyd which have been warmly and enthusiastically embraced here at St. Mary's.

We have been blessed by the exciting decision by Charlotte and Belinda to study for ALM status (which at the time of writing, they have attained).

As churchwardens, along with the PCC, we are charged with the responsibility of keeping this Grade 1 Listed Building in good repair. Throughout the year all general repairs (gutters, organ tuning, boiler service, fire extinguishers etc.) have been carried out.

The church grounds also come under the purview of the Churchwardens and to this effect a small group have maintained the grass cutting and weeding.

The clock has been working intermittently and much discussion about this has taken place on social media. At the time of writing this has temporarily been fixed but we have received an official complaint which is now being investigated by Environmental Health).

We have been fortunate that a bellringing team from Stanground have been organising ringers for weddings and they do visual checks on the bells on our behalf.

As officers of the bishop and as your Churchwardens, Ann and I can report that, this year, Revs. Emily and Lloyd have continued to work endlessly in prayer and fellowship for all of us. It must be said that they have not always had an easy time and yet, they prayerfully stuck to their calling. They wanted the best for all of us and our community. Sadly, they have both felt that they could not continue in God's service within the Whittlesey Team with the negativity they have received from some people within the Team. So it is with heavy hearts that we find ourselves in interregnum.

However, Rev. Emily and Lloyd have left us, here at St. Mary's, in a good position spiritually. We have been equipped with a strong sense of where we want to be as a congregation, we are truly a church family and we want to continue in our worship pattern. Rev. Rachael, from the CSK church at Hampton, will guide us and our Teaching Team in our services and worship. Rev. Andrew Smith, the Rural Dean and Rev. Richard Harlow, the Archdeacon, will both support us through this time.

# Treasurer's report

Please note that for the purpose of this report this is a draft copy of the accounts still to be agreed with the auditors and approved by the PCC. This is because the donation section is still to be amended to better reflect the categories listed, although overall total figures are believed to be correct.

In 2024 an income total of £38,595.78 was received by St Mary's. This compared with expenditure of £32,737.32 leaving a surplus of £5,858.46.

## **Expenses**

Expenditure increased in 2024 by £3,813.72. The main expense variation is in Gas and Electricity costs. We have discussed this in the year as a PCC as the heating has been more in the winter months in 2024 in order to reflect our church values. The Gas and Electricity expense for 2024 was £6,761.96 compared to £2,657.34 in 2023.

Please note that even though the largest expense was the Parish Share in 2024 (£14,200, which the PCC paid £600 monthly and then an additional payment of £7,000), there was still a shortfall of £10,047. Although this is a decrease on 2023's shortfall of £12,828.

## **Income**

Overall income is very similar to 2023 at £38,849.69 and in 2024 £38,595.78.

Parish giving has increased in 2024 as expected, as this scheme was introduced in 2023.

Grants are another important part of our income and we are grateful to the Whittlesey Charity for the grant money received in 2024.

Please note that our overall grant income has decreased in 2024 by £4,513.44, and that we received no legacies in 2024 as in the previous year.

# *Electoral Roll report*

What is the purpose of the Electoral Roll. It is a list of persons who want to be able to either be eligible to be on the PCC and/or be allowed to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. The number of persons on the list also dictates how many PCC members there can be.

Under Church Rules a new Electoral Roll must be prepared every six years with 2025 being the sixth year. The new roll had to be completed at least 15 days, but no more than 28 days, before the Annual Meeting so a cut off date was agreed as the 3rd May for the ACPM 18th May 2025.

The 2024 Electoral Roll contained 52 names. Due to the various changes to services a number of persons decided to no longer attend services at St Marys and have not wished to add their names to the 2025 Electoral Roll. In addition, sadly two long serving members of the St Marys congregation passed away, with one other moving away.

The new Electoral Roll contains 32 names

# Safeguarding report

It is the legal responsibility of each PCC to fulfill their duty of care towards all those present during worship, all church sponsored activities and activities in the church buildings. In practice this means adopting an appropriate safeguarding policy, appointing a safeguarding officer and generally ensuring that all of our practices and procedures comply with the policy and with the relevant law.

We have a Safeguarding Policy which is reviewed annually. Anna Noble was co-opted to the PCC as Safeguarding Officer in August 2024. We are grateful to Anna for taking on this role and the work she has done so far to get up to speed with the requirements.

All DBS checks are up to date. Safeguarding training has been made available to all who are required to complete it. Safeguarding has been a standing item on the agenda of every PCC meeting.

# Deanery Synod report

Meetings in were held in May, September, November 2024 and January 2025

The Deanery Synod was without a Lay Chair for the second year running.

There were two main topics of discussion at the meetings this year:

1. **The Deanery Development and Diocesan Strategy.** A conversation at the May meeting reflected on the issues surrounding the Parish Share, how it is used and allocated and accepting that since the Covid pandemic many parishes in the March Deanery have not been able to pay their Share in full.

At the November meeting we discussed the allocation of the Parish Share which had increased by 7.5% following a levelling of the playing field across all deaneries in the diocese. The Deanery is asked for an extra £9,000 on top of the annual percentage increase. It was agreed that the £9,000 would be paid from Deanery funds to take some of the burden off the parishes.

2. **Growing confident and healthy church communities.** A conversation over several meetings on the following topics:
  - a. Growth – in terms of numbers but also about growing individuals as Christian leaders. How we grow is different for each church.
  - b. The Green Agenda – the aim is for all churches in the Deanery to achieve bronze status on the Diocesan dashboard
  - c. Finance – parishes carrying out a ‘deep dive’ into their finances to see where income can be increased. To ensure transparency across the Deanery it was agreed that all parishes would share their financial returns for the last 3 years.

Other matters discussed at Deanery Synod included:

- Vacancies for lay representatives on Diocesan Synod
- ‘Cornerstone’ – a National church project to help parishes boost their income which the Deanery is to pilot.
- Archdeacon and Rural Dean visitations

# *Pathway Lego Club report*

As a result of taking the initial Catalyst Course there was a point where a new Youth/Children's project had to be started and run. To keep this short, a presentation is available of some 20 minutes length into the ideas behind and the structures for starting this club; we have been warmly welcomed to use the building known as St Andrew's Church Hall to hold a monthly Lego Club on the morning of the fourth Saturday in each calendar month.

We have welcomed young people with Church backgrounds and some with none. We offer juice and nothing else as we have no training in food/kitchen safety. We keep no record of the children's names, just the adults and the number of children with them. All of those in any capacity that are not parent, grandparent or carer are safely recruited. We have a risk assessment in place.

We have a story and questions based on a Bible passage, appropriate to the Church time of year or something that is easily translatable to Lego, e.g. rebuilding the walls around Jerusalem, tower of Babel, Christmas and Easter, to name a few. We remain a small group of young people, who impress us with their imaginativeness and enjoyment of the time and space that we give them. All of our Lego has been donated and Pathway Church gave us one of our two Lego Bible books.

We started in October 2024 and have managed to meet each month since then.
